



Mr. Harvey E. Perry and Mr. Bruno W. Piefke, the two remaining teachers who started at Bloomfield Tech when it opened in 1931, retired on June 30, 1964. They left behind a big gap in the hearts of their associates, but took with them the best wishes of all for many well-deserved years of health and happiness.



HARVEY E. PERRY

MR. HARVEY E. PERRY was born and raised in Newark, New Jersey. He attended Pace Institute, studying Business Administration and Accounting, then spent four years at Springfield College, majoring in Physical Education and Psychology. In 1935 he received his master's degree in School Administration from Rutgers University. Mr. Perry left distinguished records at Springfield and Rutgers, being elected to the Honor Society at both institutions. In 1946 he was listed in "Who's Who in American Education".

Before coming to the Essex County system in 1931, Mr. Perry was Physical Director at the Orange Y.M.C.A. He has always had a keen interest in service work, including scouting, Red Cross and activities of the "Y". If he heard of a job to be done, he was there to help see it through.

His first ten years at Bloomfield were in Physical Education, after which he became Guidance Counsellor. Many a graduate owes a lot to Mr. Perry.

Mr. Perry's plans are indefinite except that he does not desire complete retirement, and expects to travel.



BRUNO W. PIEFKE

MR. BRUNO W. PIEFKE was born February 16, 1901, at Astoria, New York. He was educated in New York City public schools, and graduated from Pratt Institute in 1920. He, later, attended Rutgers University.

Mr. Piefke served his apprenticeship in the machine tool and instrument fields, and worked at his profession for forty-eight years, the last thirty-five being as instructor of Machine Shop and Manufacturing Techniques in the Essex County system.

Noted for his thoroughness of instruction and understanding of teen-agers, his pupils received many awards at machine tool trade exhibits.

In spite of a heavy teaching schedule, Mr. Piefke also found time for service work. He was affiliated with the National Athletic Trainers' Association, an instructor trainer for the American Red Cross, and a director of National Boy Scout summer camps.

A member of the U.S. Power Squadron, his major recreation is boating and fishing, which he will enjoy from his home beside the bay at Beach Haven, New Jersey.

Outstanding Honor For Bloomfield Tech

The trophy is donated annually through the kindness of Joseph P. Mulford, Class of 1955.


MR. HAROLD F. BOHNSACK

Mr. Harold F. Bohnsack died suddenly on January 23, 1961. He taught Health to students in grades nine through twelve. Thus, ours, the Class of 1964, was the last to graduate having had him as a teacher.

It is fitting that we pay this small tribute to him in remembrance for, during his sixteen years at Bloomfield, Mr. Bohnsack showed that his interest in youth went far beyond the regular classroom relationship of teacher and pupil. In his early years at Tech he served efficiently and well as head basketball coach, even though he received no remuneration for this duty. His was one of the hands that formed the Essex County Basketball Tournament, which is the envy of many high schools in other counties throughout the state. In later years, Mr. Bohnsack confined his co-curricular activity to being advisor of the Student Organization. To this, he also gave unstintingly of his time and energy.

Yes, Mr. Bohnsack, we always will remember you.





JOHN BAMBARA

Mr. John Bambara, instructor in the Tool and Die Shop at Bloomfield Tech for twenty one years, passed away on November 3, 1963. He began his teaching career on July 15, 1940, as a part-time evening instructor in the War Training Program, and progressed to a full teaching appointment at Bloomfield Tech on September 1, 1942.

He was born in Argentina, South America, on December 29, 1904. He graduated from the Harrison, New Jersey public schools and then entered the Newark Technical School, now known as the Newark College of Engineering. In preparing himself for a teaching certificate he studied at the Newark State Teachers College and Rutgers University.

At Bloomfield Tech he was intensely interested in the schools' sports program and, among other things served as Athletic Manager for the football team from its inception in September 1945 until its discontinuance in 1952.

In addition to his regular daytime assignment, he also taught in the evening program during the full length of his instructorship.

Mr. Bambara was well liked and respected not only for his technical knowledge but also for his interest in vocational and general education. He served in various capacities as a leader, representative, officer and president in such professional organizations as the Essex County Vocational and Technical Teachers Association, the Essex County Education Association, the New Jersey Education Association, and the American Vocational Association. He left a deep impression on his students, and on the rest of the teaching staff at Bloomfield Tech. He will be missed for a long, long time.
