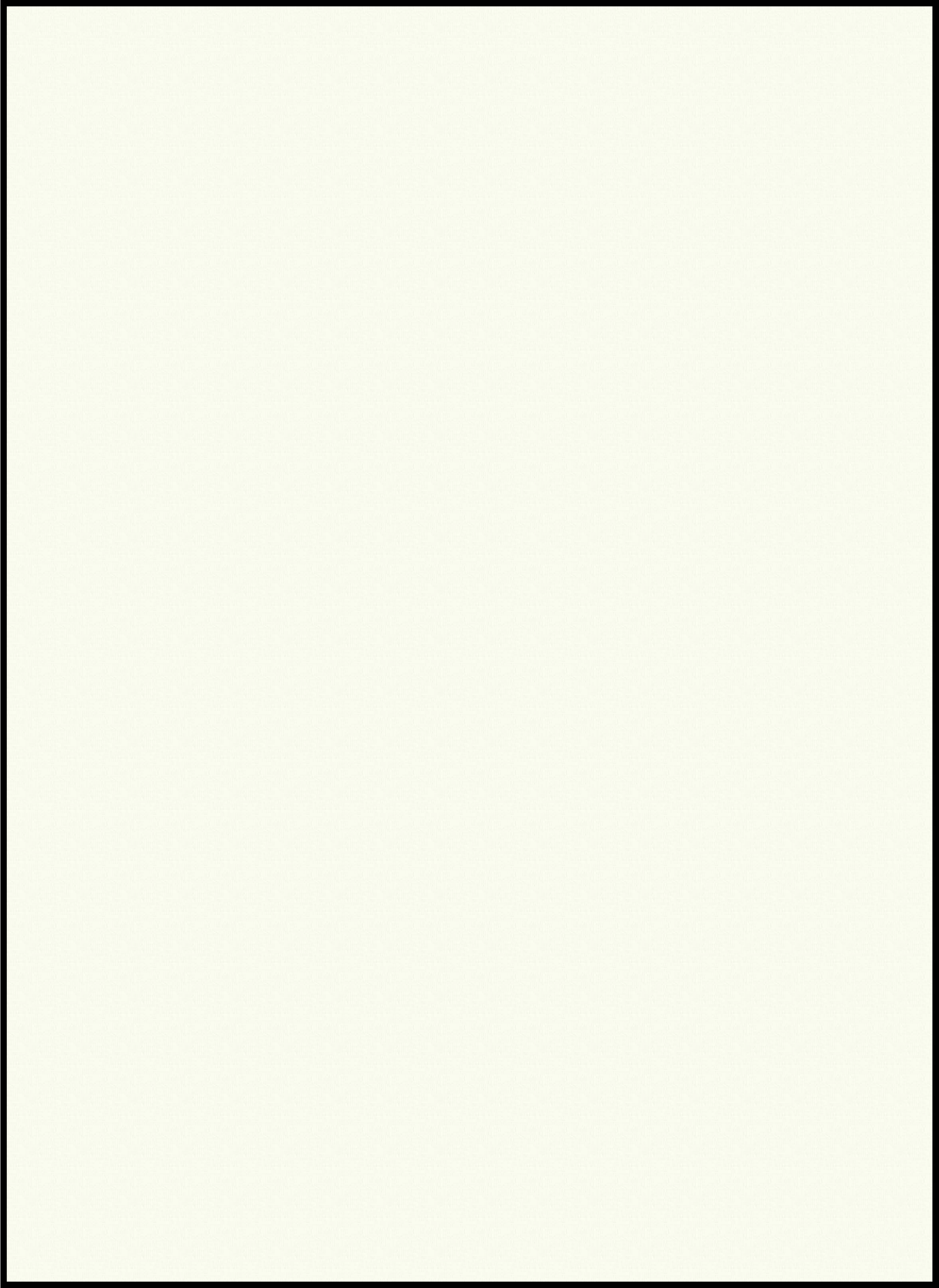

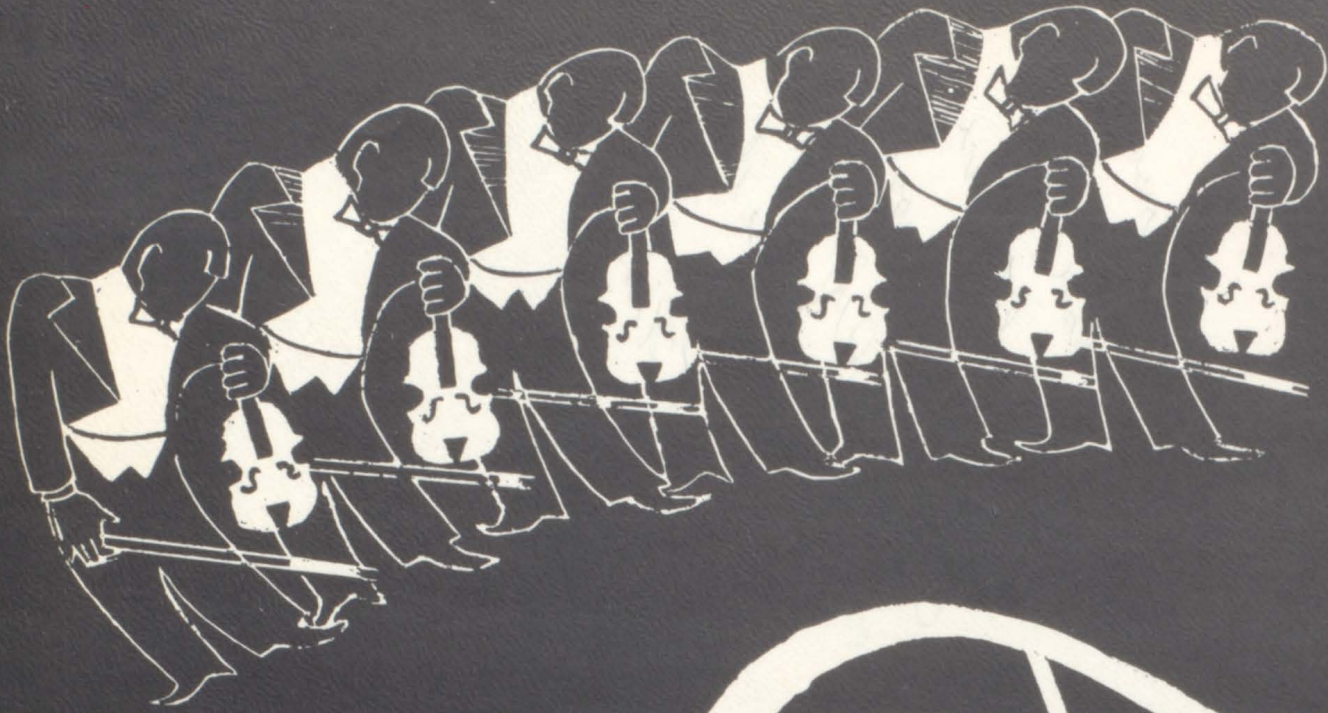

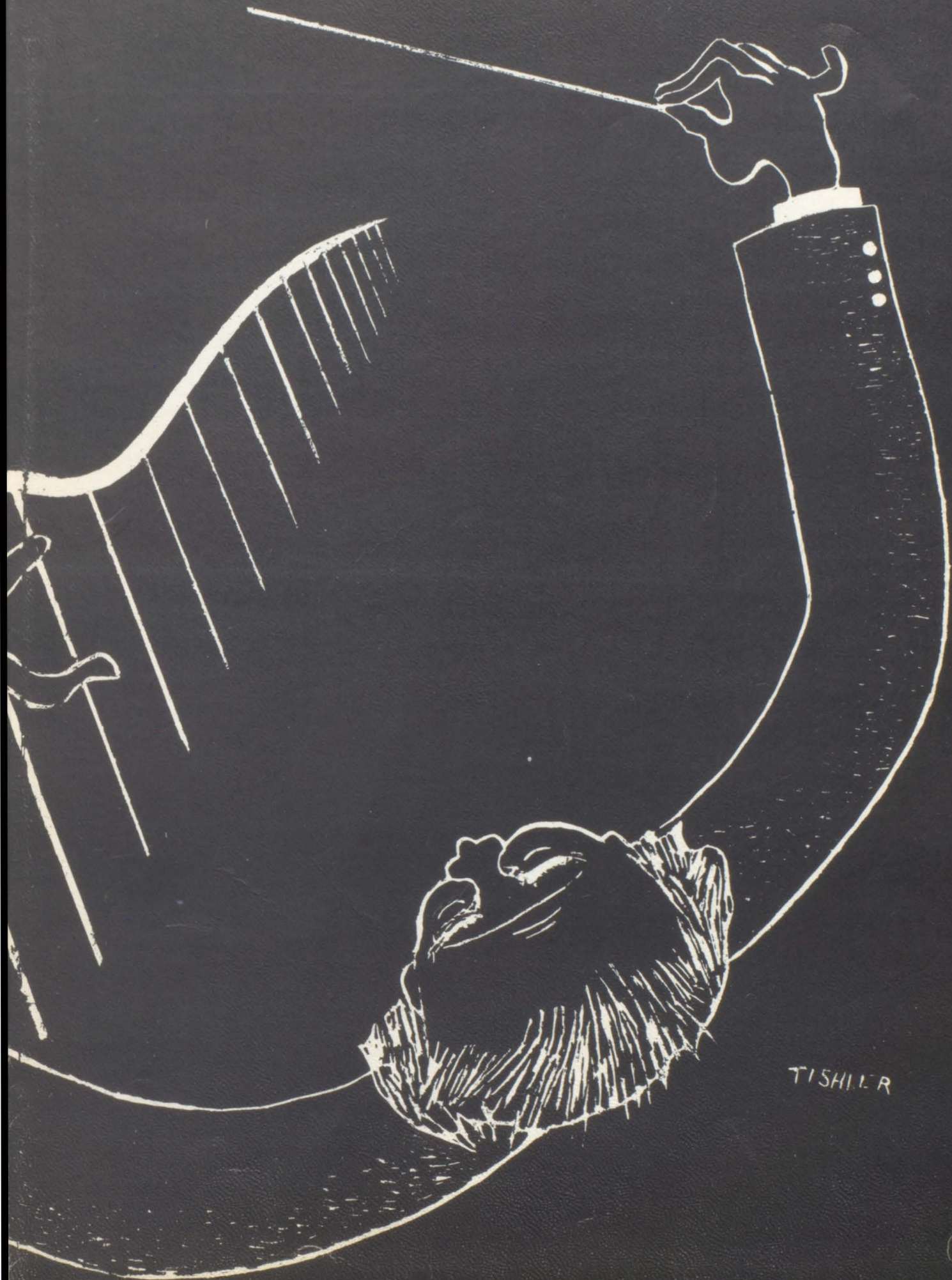
# Prelude

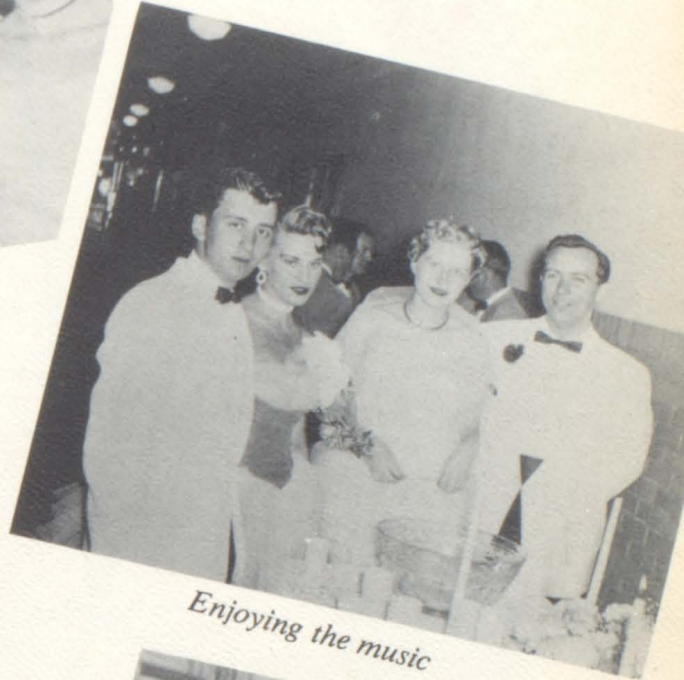
## Junior Prom
