While her extra curricular activities were not numerous, due to a busy schedule, they provided the job, experience, and sportsmanship that helped to develop her poise and character.

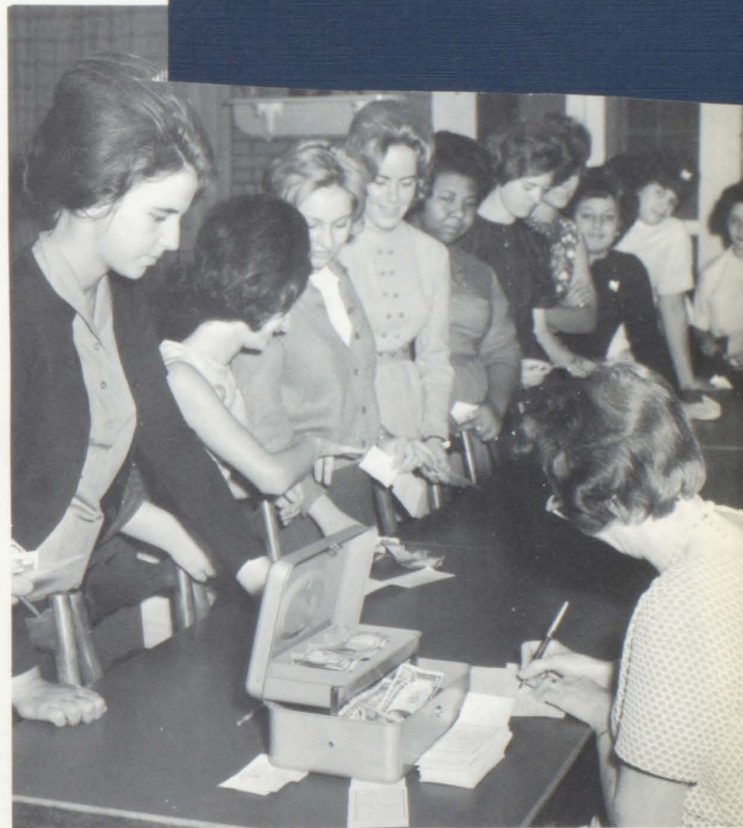

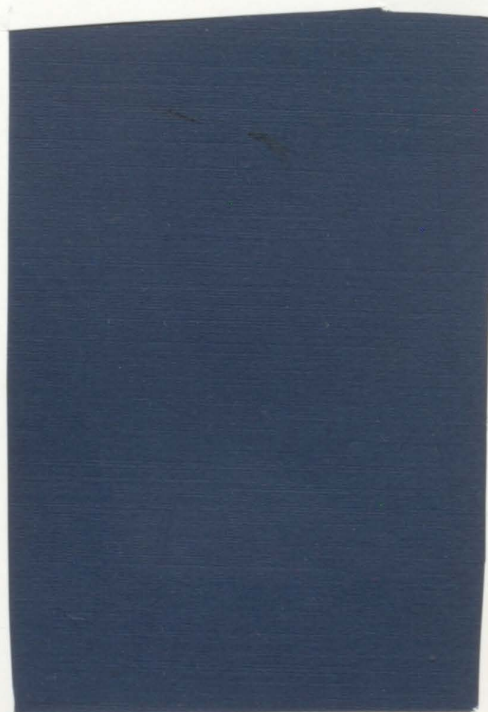

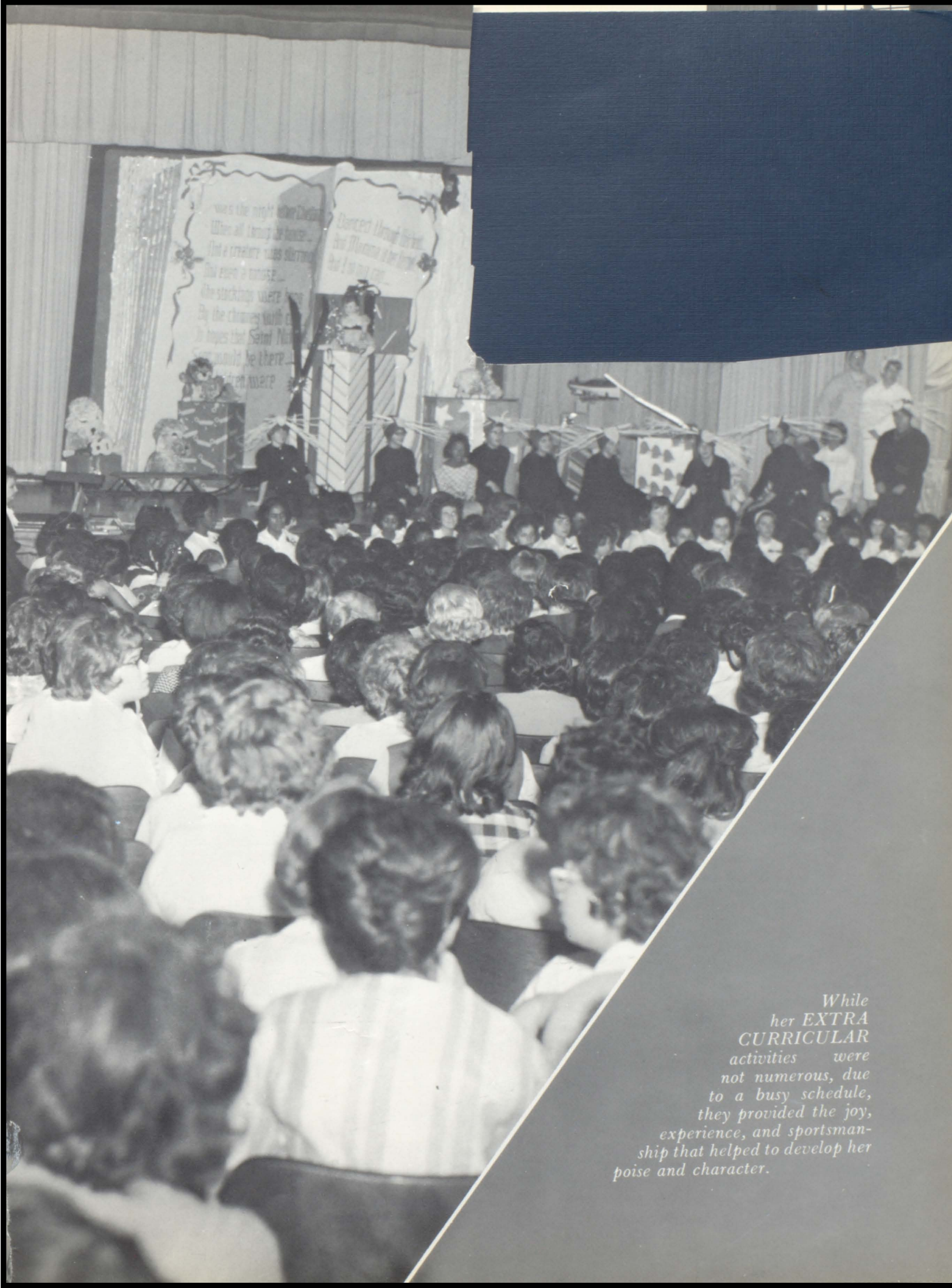

Student Council
