Authorization for the District to enter into a License Agreement for the use of Weequahic Park and Vailsburg Park with the County of Essex for a one time License Fee of \$3,450,000.00 for Twenty-Five (25) years, Capital Funds

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Schools determined that it would be in the best interest of the District if there were additional athletic fields to be utilized by the District for its practice sessions, games, and recreational activities. The Superintendent of Schools thereafter had a number of conversations/meetings with the County of Essex so as to determine if the County of Essex had sufficient athletic facilities. As a result of these conversations and/or meetings, it was determined that the County of Essex's Weequahic Park and Vailsburg Park (the "Parks") would be ideal facilities and locations to serve the District's needs.

WHEREAS, it was further determined that the Parks would require certain renovations so as to meet the District's needs and/or requirements. The estimated cost for the renovations would be in the approximate sum of \$3,450,000.00. Anthony Abbaleo, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary, has advised the District there are sufficient funds within the District's Capital Fund to fully fund the renovations which in turn will be the License Fee paid to the County of Essex in accordance with the Agreement.
