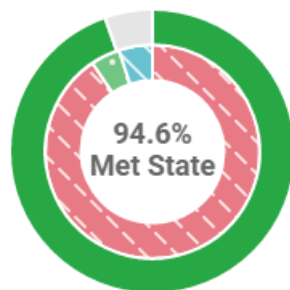
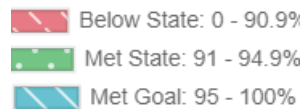

District Highlights Reported by the District:

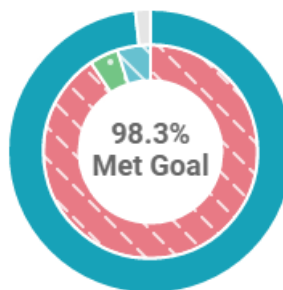
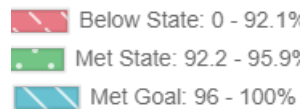

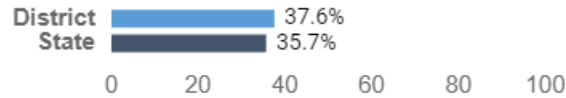

Are students college and career ready?

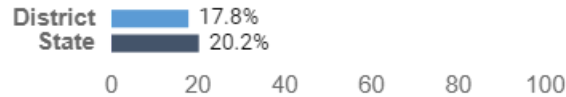
AP/IB Courses:

Percentage of 11th and 12th graders enrolled in one more dual enrollment course, which is a course that allows high school students to enroll in college courses for credit prior to graduation



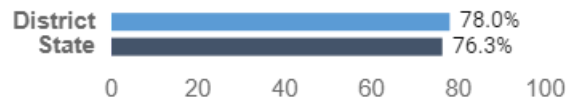
Industry-Valued Credentials:
