NJ Child Labor Laws

Your Child's Job: A Parent's Guide to Child Labor Laws

- What can you do to make your teenager's job a positive experience for everyone involved?
- Child labor laws are designed to protect the health and education of workers under 18 years of age.
- You can help your child best by knowing what those protections are and how they are enforced.

The A300 or Working Papers Form

- Children under 18 years old (minors) who work in New Jersey must have an employment certificate – also called "working papers."
 - Where can you get a copy of the Working Papers?
 - Who needs working papers and how often do you need it?
 - How to complete the Working Papers form
 - Can I complete the working papers electronically?

Other Required Employment Documents

- Your employer will require additional forms such as a W4 and I-9 before you can begin working.
 - The form W4 is required by the IRS so that the employer can process your paycheck and tax withholdings
 - A form I-9 is required to certify that you are legally authorized to work in the US
 - If you will be working for ECST, you must have a I-9 and W4 on file before you can begin working

Work-Based Learning

- What is Work-Based Learning? (Or work-study as it is commonly referred to)
 - Work-Based Learning is a new term coined in Perkins V (formerly known as Structured Learning Experiences (SLE).)
- What are some examples of WBL?
 - Job shadowing
 - Volunteering
 - Internship paid or unpaid
 - Paid employment (part of WBL)
- How do you get involved in WBL?
 - Speak to your counselor, case manager, or Instructor

Work-Based Learning - continued

Work Schedules of students in Work-Based Leaning

- Times and days of the week
- Variety of opportunities internal and external opportunities
- Who can be part of Work-Based Learning
 - Full-time or part-time students
 - Share-time students
- Forms Required for WBL
 - Agency Agreement
 - Training Plan
 - Worksite valuation
